- Preparation for two or three speaking engagements.

- Attend occasional events specially organized for Fellows, such as meetings with visiting lecturers and campus guests.
- Organize the "Open Houses of Worship" weekend visit to a synagogue, mosque, and church.
- Provide brief written assessment on your Lubar Institute experience.
